
## Daring Greatly—how a little library cohort achieves above its station Elisabeth Marrow—South Taranaki District Council, New Zealand

Our members need us: Physical visits are above National Average (10.55 vs 7.30 per pop.) Internet Access (57.43% vs 23.44% per pop.) WiFi access (physical) 33.82% vs 27.43% per pop.)

These statistics reflect the need for computer access by our communities and the need for our Plus services as well as our Library service.

#### **2018 STDC Resident Survey revealed:**

98% satisfied with the facilities and customer service at public libraries.

96% satisfied with the materials etc. provided at the public libraries.

Technology—3D printers, Bee Bots, Makey Makey, Little Bits, Ipads, Paper Circuitry, Edison, Raspberry Pi. All the libraries have an Ultimaker 2+ 3D printer and a Raspberry Pi computer for Minecraft and coding. There is also a PlayStation in each children's room. Libraries are great places for testing future technology and digital story.

In 2016/2017 there were 977 events held in the 7 LibraryPlus. 10,251 adults and children attended. Author visits, Conversations with Community Board Members, Discussions on Death, Crafty Mornings, Tai Chi for toddlers, Crossword Teas and even Morris Dancing were just some of the events held across the District.
