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PRIMO SEARCH - SEARCH FOR A JOURNAL

- In the window below search for the journal titled the Academy of Management Review. Change the drop down menu from Search All to Books, Journals, DVDs and more to help restrict your search.
- > Click View Online to see the range of CSU databases that give you access to this journal.
- Notice the one with the broadest coverage is EBSCOhost Business Source Complete which gives you access to the journal from 1976 onwards.
- > Click on the GO button next to this database. (You may then have to log in using your CSU user name and password)
- > Once in the database you will be able to search within the journal for articles relating to a topic of interest or browse the different issues.
- > Locate a recent article on the topic Leadership. When you find a suitable article save the PDF file as we will use this later in the tutorial.
