
ALIA Schools Group Survey Summary May 2023



51 respondents completed the survey.




Which of the following activities would you most like to see from an ALIA Schools Special Interest Group? Choose three:



Sample of comments:

- am concerned that there are still principals who do not understand the value of school libraries.
- the importance of having qualified library staff teacher librarians and library techniciansworking in school libraries to support our students with their learning and wellbeing needs.
- demonstrating to school leadership and state/national government the value of a well staffed and well funded library in all schools
- identifying how to best present the benefits of the school library (including the difference trained library staff make) to all school staff
- funding, role of libraries for students, teacher librarian impacts on literacy, etc.
- many schools only employ library staff as Term Time employees. I think this is wrong and that library staff should be treated similar to teaching staff. It's wrong that a school can permanently employ you but not pay you during school holidays or that it doesn't count towards long service leave. Would rather work the school holidays and be treated as a professional staff member.
