Background

- 1820s Shire of Wanneroo a regional hamlet located to the north of the Perth CBD
- 1903 55 individuals registered
- 1949 946 individuals registered
- Today, combined population 343,000 and growing




Background cont'd...

- City of Joondalup established 1998
- Historical collection separated
 - City of Wanneroo Museum based
 - City of Joondalup Local Studies/History based



To Publish or Not to Publish

- Portrays the social history of the region
- Highly pictorial
- Showcases the collection of local history photographs, historical maps, archival and ephemera items
- Enhances the digitisation project
- A visual record for future generations



Digitisation Project

- 4 year funded project 2008/2009 to 2011/2012
- 2008-2009 Phase I: Acquisition of new equipment.

Assessment of the Heritage Collection.

• 2009-2010 Phase 2: Transfer Oral History Collection from analogue to digital.

Reference and Local History team trained in digitisation best practices.

2010-2011 Phase 3: Digitisation of 25% of the photographic collection

Creation of Picture Joondalup.



Picture Joondalup

- Serves as the online platform to publish the City's photographic heritage collection
- A full comprehensive historical research accompanying each item of the pictorial collection was regarded as Picture Joondalup's signature style and one of the project's most important quality assurance focus points
- Ongoing promotion of the project continues to unearth hidden gems, local stories and significant donations




Digitisation and Beyond

- 2011-2012 Phase 4: Digitisation of final 75% (7,000 images). Digitisation of the Motion Picture Collection and the development of dynamic interaction and integration combining all digital assets.
- 2013 to present Complete project incorporated into operational practice
- 14,000+ items have been digitised to date



What would it look like?

- Pictorial book
- 200 pages
- I2 Chapters
- Photographs and captions
- Original research
- Writing, research and graphic design In house
- Proof reading internal and external
- Printing (External)
- Grant application required



Objectives

- Be the first publication to examine the photographic historical record of the region
- Contribute to the understanding of the region's historical importance
- Be a research tool and provide access to a wide range of photographs and historical content in one volume
- Broad Community appeal and educational resource
- Document the rich photographic history of the region
- Recognise the important historical contribution of the region to WA



Finalising the Costs

- Look at other publications
- Concept quotes for perspective
- Grant opportunities
- Think about other costs: editing, design, promotion and cost of publication
- A grant application was submitted to the Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities in the Category of Your Community Heritage Program 2012-2013
- Our application was successful May 2013. Picture our Past (POP) was born.

Edit and Design


- 4 x drafts to be proofread
